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CAMP OVERVIEW

The California Waterfowl Association's camps introduce new hunters to the sport and traditions of waterfowling. Campers learn from experts in the field with a safe, positive and supportive environment.

At camp, you will learn about or hone skills with shotguns, waterfowl identification, gear, decoys and lots more. Campers will take the test for earning a hunter education certificate.

ABOUT CWA

The California Waterfowl Association (CWA) is a nonprofit organization, whose mission is to conserve the state's waterfowl, wetlands, and hunting heritage. Over 20,000 members support the association's conservation and outdoor heritage programs.

Waterfowl Resource Programs

CWA focuses its conservation efforts on four species of waterfowl. The mallard, pintail, wood duck, and goose programs cover much of the spectrum of wetlands and uplands located in California and the Pacific Flyway. These programs benefit more than 200 wildlife species. Each one poses unique challenges in habitat conservation, government action, education, and population enhancement.

7:30 AM: Pheasant hunt overview and safety discussion.

12:00PM: Lunch provided.

1:00 PM: Break for the day.

Circumstances arise that may result in the cancellation of your registration. If we are able to refill the spot, your camp fee is refundable minus a \$20 processing fee. If we are unable to refill the spot, the entire camp fee is non-refundable.

The Coordinator holds current First Aid and CPR cards. See *Camper Health Record* for additional information in case of emergency.

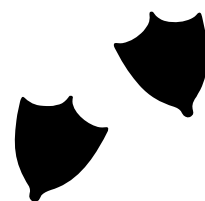
Telephone Regulations
