CAMP OVERVIEW

The California Waterfowl Association's camps introduce juniors to the sport and traditions of waterfowling. Juniors learn from experts in the field with a safe, positive and supportive environment.

At camp, juniors will learn about or hone their skills with shotguns, waterfowl identification, gear, decoys and lots more. Juniors will receive hunter education instruction and complete the test for earning their hunter education certificate.

ABOUT CWA

The California Waterfowl Association (CWA) is a nonprofit organization, whose mission is to conserve the state's waterfowl, wetlands, and hunting heritage. Over 20,000 members support the association's conservation and outdoor heritage programs.

CAMP PROGRAM INFORMATION

Arrival and Departure

Campers are to check in at Mystic Lake Duck Club at 8:30 am on Saturday, March 19th. Please do not arrive early.

Saturday, March 17th

8:30 AM: Collect paperwork, check-in and store personal belongings.

9:00 AM: Parents and campers will be given an overview of the camp. After the overview, campers will be transported to San Jacinto WA for hunter safety instruction and parents are free to leave.

Sunday, March 18th

3:30 PM: 'Graduation ceremony'

Parents should plan to attend a brief graduation ceremony on Sunday. Please arrive by 3:15 pm and bring a chair to relax while we celebrate your camper's experiences at camp and give them some goodies. After the ceremony, the campers will be released to their parents or guardians and should plan to collect all of their belongings.

Note: If the parent or guardian will not be picking up their camper, please inform the camp coordinator who they should be released to at the end of camp.

Cancellation Policy

Circumstances arise that may result in the cancellation of your camper's registration. If we are able to refill the spot, your camp fee is refundable minus a \$20 processing fee. If we are unable to refill the spot, the entire camp fee is non-refundable.

Correspondence

Campers will be very active during their stay at camp and we don't anticipate them needing to contact anyone. They will be having a great time at camp learning and discovering new things. See emergency contact numbers if you must contact your child during camp.

Food Regulations

Please do not supply your child with food, chewing gum, candy, etc. during their stay at camp. We provide ample, balanced meals, and numerous light snacks. The food can attract ants and mice to the campsite and may also cause hard feelings among the other campers. All food brought by the campers will be confiscated by the camp staff. Please let us know if your camper has a food allergy or restricted diet.

Hospital

Moreno Valley Community Hospital is located at 27300 Iris Ave, Moreno Valley, CA approximately 10 miles away. Their phone number is (951) 243-0811.

Hunter Education

Hunter Education Instructors have the discretion of deciding whether a student is given the final examination after completing at least ten hours of instruction. Upon evaluation, if the student does not display the appropriate maturity level when handling firearms, the student will not be given the final examination. Students displaying inappropriate behavior will not be certified regardless of knowledge or skill level.

Medical – First Aid

The Coordinator holds current First Aid and CPR cards. See *Camper Health Record* for additional information in case of emergency.

Medications

All medications must have the child's name, medication name and strength, dosage and the prescribing doctor's name and phone number on each bottle. Also send written administering directions from the doctor. Please place medications and instructions in a zip lock bag with the child's name printed in bold letters on the outside. **Give bag and instructions to the camp coordinator for administration.**

Telephone Regulations

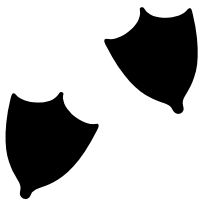
We ask parents only to call the camp in an emergency situation. If your child is homesick or has an emergency you will be notified immediately.

DIRECTIONS TO MYSTIC LAKE DUCK CLUB

Mystic Lake Duck Club is approx. 5 miles east of Lake Perris near Perris/Lakeview/Nuevo, CA. The key street is **Davis Road** that is accessed off the Ramona Expressway.

From San Diego

Take the 5 north to the 215 north as if going to Riverside. Stay on the 215 north to the Ramona Expressway/Caljalco exit and turn east (right).

Proceed east as if you are driving to Lake Perris. Go approximately 8 ½ miles to Davis Road. You will pass by the Lake Perris Fairgrounds and dirt bike track on the left and new houses and school on the right. Continue on the Expressway over the big hill until you cross Davis Road, which is on the left. At Davis Road there is a tree line and row of houses on the left and a small pink grocery store on the right side of the Expressway. Turn north (left) onto Davis Road.

Take Davis Rd approx 1.9 miles where you will see a dirt road on the right. You will see a Ramona Hunt Club sign. Take this dirt road east approx ¼ mile where the road forks. Take the right fork through the iron gate. It will be open. You will see the Ramona Hunt Club trailer park on the right side of the road up ¼ mile. Stay to the left. The Mystic Lake Duck Club is ¼ mile past the Ramona Hunt Club. You will come to the gated entrance of the Mystic Lake Duck Club. The gate will be open.

Drive through the gate and follow the gravel road. The Club House is the first structure on the right next to a concrete patio. Meet at the Club House.



From Los Angeles

Take 91 east through Corona. Exit at Van Buren, which is about 10-20 miles east of Corona. Proceed south (right) on Van Buren. Take Van Buren to the 215 Fwy south (approx 15 min). Van Buren ends at the 215, which is at March AFB.

Take the 215 Fwy south (right) to the Ramona Expressway/San Jacinto exit (2nd exit from Van Buren) as if you are driving to Lake Perris. Take the Ramona Expressway exit and go east (left) 8.5 miles to Davis Road.

At Davis Road there is a small grocery store on the right hand (south) side of the street painted pink, and there is a row of very old homes with trees on Davis Road on the north side of the highway. Turn north (left) onto Davis Road. Take Davis Rd 1.9 miles where you will see a dirt road on the right. Take this turn. You will immediately see a Ramona Hunt Club sign. You will drive approx ¼ mile to where the road forks; take the right fork through an iron gate. The gate will be open.

Proceed ½ mile down this road. You will see the Ramona Hunt Club trailer park campgrounds on the right. Stay to the left and continue east on the main dirt/gravel road until you reach the gate of the Mystic Lake Duck Club. There will be a Mystic Lake Duck Club sign at the gate.
