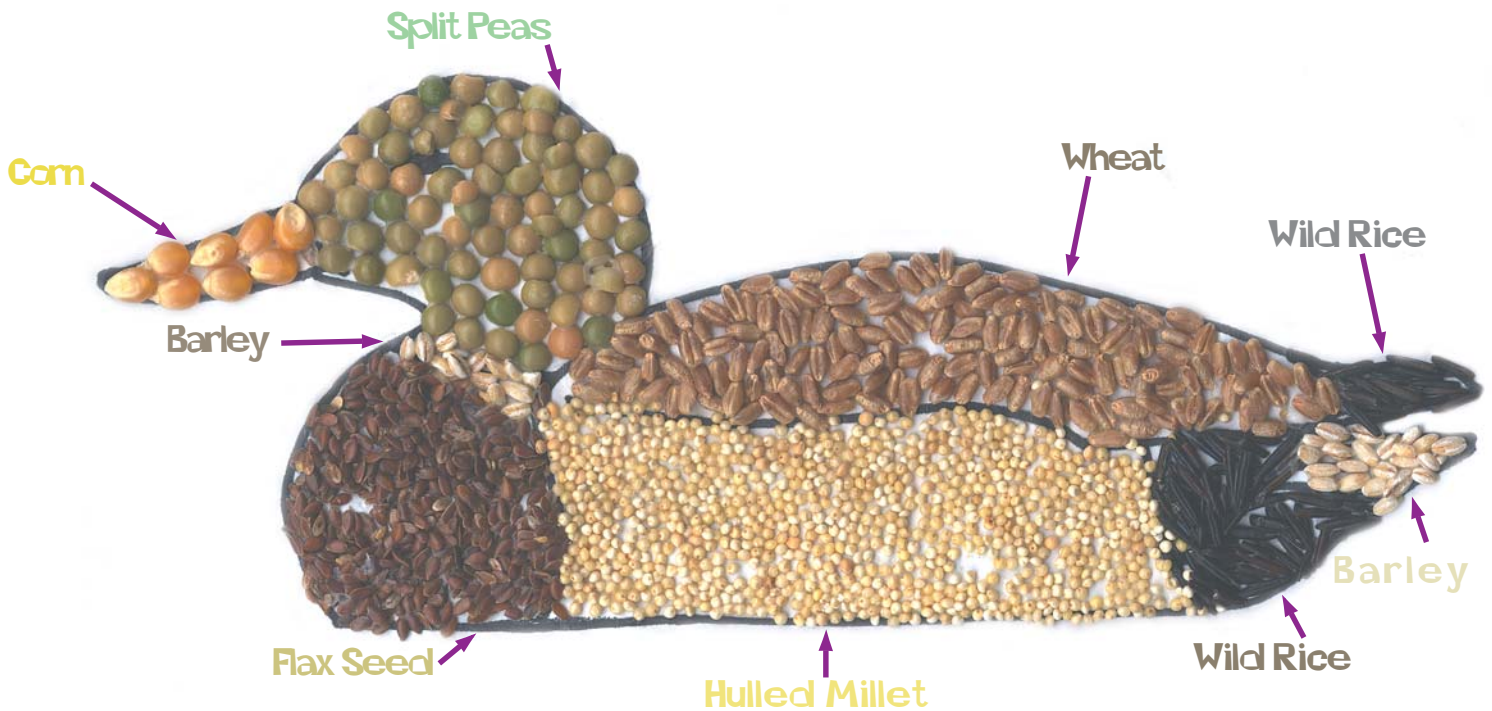


# Greenheads and Grains.

More than 90% of California's original wetlands are gone, so agricultural areas have become valuable feeding and nesting habitats. During the winter, waterfowl eat leftover grains such as wheat, oats, corn, rice, beans, and millet. The birds clean up the field for the farmer AND get the energy they need to grow new feathers, migrate, and produce young.



Explore this special working relationship between farmers and waterfowl by creating a waterfowl mosaic. You'll need glue and some beans and seeds. You can use rice, wheat, millet, barley, corn, oats, peas, lentils, sunflower - any bean or seed you can find! They come in all sizes, shapes, and colors.
